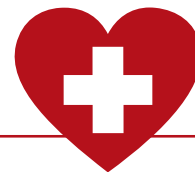
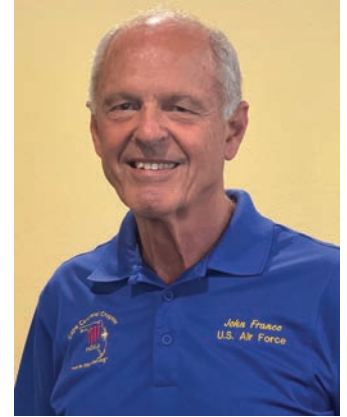

April Countdown

Congress returned to Capitol Hill mid-April facing a mountain of government funding work. The uphill slog will involve getting House and Senate Republicans on the same page about the party-line tax and spending bills they plan to pass by June 1 to fund immigration agencies and potentially other partisan priorities. Then, the House could take up the Senate-passed fiscal 2026 Homeland Security bill, which would provide fresh funding for FEMA and other beleaguered DHS agencies for the first time in nearly two months. While those processes play out, appropriators will finally be able to start picking through the White House's fiscal 2027 budget request, welcoming agency heads and other administration officials to the Capitol to question them on their funding proposals. These three priorities will dominate much of the legislative agenda over the course of the next month.

The month of April brought the culmination of tax season as well as MOAA's annual Advocacy in Action (AiA) campaign in which our leaders meet face-to-face with members of Congress and their staffs to promote awareness and support for our priority issues. These are: End the Wounded Veteran Tax; Protect Servicemember Pay During Federal Shutdowns; Stop Predatory VA Claims Agents and Protect Veterans' Earned Benefits; and Improve Access to Care at Military Facilities.

As in any successful campaign, a multi-prong attack provides the best chance for success which translates into us members "taking action" in the form of reinforcing the in-person interface with cards and letters, made easy by accessing the AiA page on the MOAA website: moaa.quorum.us. From there, it's a simple process of reviewing the letter drafts provided by MOAA, making any edits, additions or deletions you deem appropriate, and then hitting "send" to our 2 US Senators and Congressman Haridopolos. I did this yesterday in less than 15 minutes, and today received a response from Senator Moody already touting her support for "the Pay Our Military Act of 2025 (S. 3030) to ensure pay for all members of our Armed Forces in the event of a government shutdown, and the Eliminate Shutdowns Act of 2025 (S. 2806) to automatically extend the previous congressionally approved budget". In any event, our MOAA president and CEO, Lt. Gen. Brian T. Kelly, USAF (Ret), suggests we register for MOAA's Legislative Action Center to stay connected to our lawmakers, and review all four Advocacy in Action topics on the AiA website and

share these issues with your network.

MOAA also announced a recent court ruling that prevents the VA from downgrading disability ratings based on effective medical treatment. The U.S. Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims ruled in favor of an Army veteran that "unless the VA's own rating schedule says otherwise, the VA must not give a lower disability rating to a veteran because they take medication that helps treat their condition". MOAA and other veteran advocacy groups called for the VA to end its legal fight in February, after the department published, then rescinded, a rule the VA said would "clarify existing policy and protect veterans' benefits in the wake of an ongoing court action." MOAA disagreed with that interpretation of the rule, saying instead that it "fails to account for treatment burdens, creates harmful incentives, destabilizes access to benefits, and was promulgated without adequate public input." That's another example of advocacy in action, this time in the courts.

As a follow-up to last month's Legislative Update on The War Powers Resolution (WPA) of 1973, another (the 4th) vote was taken in the Senate on a resolution to block President Trump from ordering further strikes on Iran after the two sides reached a fragile ceasefire. The law requires presidents to remove U.S. forces from any conflict that Congress has not authorized within 60 days. The president can obtain a 30-day extension if he certifies to Congress that it is an "unavoidable military necessity," but the White House has not said whether he would seek a 30-day extension. The 60-day threshold occurs on 1 May. With most Senate democrats (except Senator Fetterman, D-PA) supporting the resolution, it's notable that two previous Democrat presidents, Clinton and Obama, ignored the law and violated the 60-day threshold. Clinton failed to comply with the WPA when he ordered the bombing of Kosovo in 1999, though his administration argued that Congress implicitly authorized the strikes because it passed legislation to fund them within 60 days of the start of the campaign. And Obama did not seek authorization from Congress before ordering strikes on Libya in 2011, which continued beyond the 60-day threshold.

Precedent seems to rule the day. Whatever your political leanings, we should endeavor to influence our government, and especially our Congressional representatives in the House and Senate, through strong advocacy, a no-brainer as active members of MOAA.

The Honor of Our Service Mottos

You hear a “Semper Fi” and immediately know a Marine is in the area. Hats off to the USMC that drills its members to know, recite, and live by its motto, in uniform or not.

How about the rest of us? As an Army guy, I admit that I didn’t know my own motto and had to look it up. It’s ironic I could wish a Marine colleague a hearty “Semper Fi” but couldn’t greet an Army buddy with our motto since neither of us know it! May we each be able to sound off with our motto in pride of the service we’ve had the privilege of joining. See if you recognize your own from this list...

U.S. Army: “This We’ll Defend.” As the oldest branch of the military, the Army’s motto is steeped in a long history of national service. It was first used in 1778 by the Continental Army War Office during the American Revolution.

U.S. Marine Corps: “Semper Fidelis.” Established in 1883, the phrase is Latin for “Always Faithful” The motto embodies the Marine Corps’ forever loyalty and commitment to both their fellow Marines and the country.

U.S. Navy: “Non-Sibi Sed Patriae.” The Navy does not have an official motto, but many sources claim this as the unofficial one. “Not self, but country” is inscribed with sacred honor since 1908 above the chapel doors of the Naval Academy.

U.S. Coast Guard: “Semper Paratus.” “Always Ready” is appropriate for a service on call 365 days a year to protect our waterways and citizens. The motto was first bestowed by a newspaper in 1836 in praise of the Guard’s action off the Texas coast.

U.S. Air Force: “Aim High...Fly-Fight-Win.” Adopted in 2010, the Air Force’s motto is both a call to action and a promise in response. The Air Force pushes itself to new heights in guarding America’s skies and taking the fight to any place on the globe.

U.S. Space Force: “Semper Supra.” Our newest service’s motto meaning “Always Above” was established in 2020. Just as space is unending in time and depth, so is the Space Force’s commitment to protect and monitor space. The motto is both the act of looking up and wondering what is beyond.

And this last note to my Army compatriots: Take a closer look at our official emblem. Our motto is there, in ALL CAPS, being uttered by a vigilant rattlesnake! Indeed... THIS WE’LL DEFEND.

SURVIVOR ASSISTANCE REBIRTH

The recommended concept for the rebirth of the MOAACC Survivor Assistance Program was approved by the MOAACC BOD. The concept is to concentrate on raising awareness of the membership to PREPARING for the passing of the first spouse. When this is done the initial notifications to government agencies can take place in an efficient and timely manner. The second part of this effort is to build a Surviving Spouse Liaison (SSL) awareness program for all MOAACC members to better understand & perhaps get better organized. Having everything in one secure location &/or in a portable device; guide/booklet, laptop or cell can really make it easier for the surviving spouse.

Some of the problems which have been found are: no preparation, only limited understanding of what a Surviving Spouse needs to do and why; not sharing passwords; missing key critical information; misunderstanding when certain tasks need to be done; keeping their personal information current; and not identifying a person to close out the estate after both spouses have passed. All of these can cause wasted time and effort, frustrations and emotions to surface unnecessarily. We should get PREPARED and review our plans to make sure they are still current. It does not take long to get PREPARED; it’s just getting started!

MOAACC Website Transition Complete

Improved Performance—Same Familiar Experience

The Military Officers Association of America Cape Canaveral Chapter (MOAACC) has successfully completed a major transition to a new website platform.

While most of the work occurred behind the scenes, the goal was simple: **improve performance, reliability, and long-term capability**—without changing the look and feel our members are familiar with.

As a result, you should experience a smoother, more efficient website, even though everything appears largely the same on the surface.

What You Need to Know

- **Use the correct website address**

Please be sure to access the site using:

www.moaacc.org

Including the “www” is important, as the new platform is optimized specifically for this format.

- **Security prompt message**

Due to recent updates and changes to the website—particularly related to accessing **moaacc.org** (without the “www”)—some users may encounter a browser security alert when attempting to access the site.

This appears to be related to how the new platform is being recognized by certain browsers. If you see this message, you may choose to proceed based on your own discretion; no issues have been reported.

Best practice: Always access the website using www.moaacc.org to help avoid this issue.

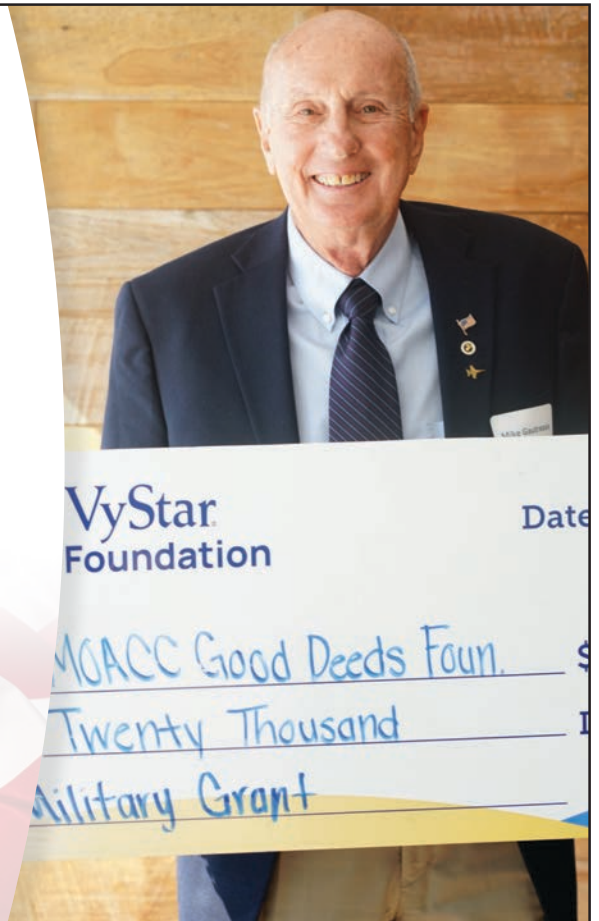

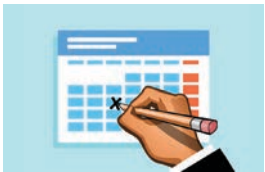

This includes being mindful of their online presence, avoiding the disclosure of sensitive information, and reporting any suspicious activity they encounter.

Continuing education and training are also vital for Retired Soldiers. Antiterrorism tactics and strategies are constantly evolving, and it is important for veterans to stay abreast of the latest developments. Army installation antiterrorism officers can help to keep Retired Soldiers informed through antiterrorism awareness outreach programs.

The conversation can last thirty minutes or up to two hours depending on your preference. The story can include your service and how your life was spent after the military. Remember hundreds of veterans have told their stories which are preserved forever on the BVMC YouTube Channel and in the LOC.

NEVER STOP SERVING

Is Your Email Address Still “@cfl.rr.com”? Here’s What You Need to Know

Many of our members have used Roadrunner-style email addresses (such as cfl.rr.com, @rr.com, or roadrunner.com) for years. These accounts were originally created through Bright House and Time Warner Cable and are now part of Spectrum. While these email addresses still work today, they are considered legacy accounts, and several changes in recent months have affected their reliability.

What’s Happening?

- Spectrum no longer creates new Roadrunner-style email addresses. Some users have reported trouble connecting these older accounts to email apps like Outlook, Apple Mail, or smartphones. Spectrum support has indicated that parts of the old Roadrunner system are being phased out or migrated to newer platforms. In some cases, if a customer stops Spectrum internet service, the old “rr.com” mailbox may be shut down.

Why This Matters

For many long-time users, the cfl.rr.com address has been stable for decades. But as the legacy system ages, the risk of service interruptions grows. Losing access to an email account can also mean losing password recovery options, contacts, subscriptions, and important messages. Additionally, within MOAACC we are now seeing a noticeable increase in “bounce-backs” when sending out chapter communications. Emails sent to cfl.rr.com addresses—including the Intercom, Five Things, event notices, and other important updates—are bouncing at a higher rate than in the past. When an email “bounces,” it means the message did not reach the member. As a result, some members may not be receiving critical chapter information without realizing it.

Recommendations

If your cfl.rr.com email is still working, you do not need to give it up immediately. However, now is an excellent time to begin preparing for the future:

1. Set up a new, modern email account. Consider creating a free and reliable account such as Gmail (Google), Outlook.com (Microsoft), or Yahoo Mail. These are well-supported and are not tied to your internet provider.
2. Update your important accounts gradually. Begin updating your email address with banks, medical portals, Social Security, recurring bills, and newsletters. Take your time—this transition does not need to happen all at once.
3. Save or forward your important messages. Make sure any vital information stored in your old Roadrunner mailbox is backed up or forwarded to your new address.
4. Keep your Roadrunner address active if it works. Continue checking it for any notices from Spectrum and for messages from contacts who have not yet updated their records.

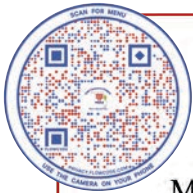
Bottom Line

Your cfl.rr.com address may continue to function for now, but it is part of an older system that could eventually be discontinued. Taking a proactive approach—while the account is still working—will help ensure you don’t lose important messages or miss essential chapter communications.
