
Back in Session

Things have been slow in the halls of Congress as it has been on recess since the end of March; it launched back into session beginning Monday, 17 April, following the Easter/ Passover break. As it reconvened, the agenda is packed full of hearings in both chambers on the President's Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Budget proposal and other pressing matters. Meanwhile, the looming debt crisis continues to hover over Washington and the Nation's economic outlook. There was some recent good news on the rate of inflation abating down to about 5.0% but the Fed will probably continue to inch rates upward in order to get it closer to its annual rate target of about 2%. The epic battle has begun between the Administration and within the split Congress on WHAT to negotiate on the enormous spending side of the budget and to "frame the narrative" in politically advantageous terms. There seems to be agreement on at least one thing—the Debt Ceiling will be raised. But it needs to be done in a timely manner to avoid any hint of default which would necessarily "nuke" the hobbling economy-and this points to the need to negotiate NOW! There is also a growing sense that the economy will slip into recession sooner or later this year which will only be exacerbated by the prospect of default. So, as much as I hate to sound like a broken record, the time is now to get this debt ceiling crisis behind us.

A recent Congressional Budget Office (CBO) report on the first 6 months of FY2023 presents an ugly picture with the deficit already hitting \$1.1 Trillion, some \$430 Billion more than this time last year. The culprit is a combination of new spending emanating from the Democrats' four big spending bills since the end of the Trump administration and the first two years of the Biden administration. That HUGE 6-month deficit included \$308 Billion in interest payments on the debt and increases in spending for Social Security (up 10% or \$61 Billion), Medicare (up 14% or \$49 Billion) and Medicaid (up 8% or \$22 Billion). The rate of inflation is eating our lunch as are relaxed eligibility rules for Medicaid. Revenues were down by 3% in the same period.

This revenue situation will be addressed over the next ten years as the IRS announced its plans for its \$80 Billion infusion focused on improving customer service and cracking down on wealthy tax evaders. This overhaul is part of President Biden's agenda to reduce the Nation's \$7 Trillion of uncollected tax revenue and make tax collection "fairer". The 80,000-employee IRS is 20% smaller than it was in 2010 and its new Commissioner, Daniel Werfel, intends to hire new staff (accountants, attorneys and data scientists) to pursue high-income and high-wealth individuals, complex partnerships and large corporations that are not paying the taxes they owe. Werfel has pledged not to increase the historic audit rate on households or small businesses making less than \$400K.

Finally, the recent Banking crisis involving "smaller, regional banks", seems to have at its core a problem with declining values of their loan portfolios and/or declining values of their equity portfolios, both of which are driven by rising interest rates. When people sense that their bank has assumed too much risk and is accumulating too much imbalance in their portfolios, a "bank run" can ensue causing bank liquidity challenges that must be addressed immediately; or else. Or else happened recently at no fewer than two large regional banks and the FDIC had to step in to take over the banks. Insured and uninsured deposits were backed up by the government in an unprecedented way that calls into question what exactly is insured. Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen promised "the intervention necessary to protect the broader US banking system and similar actions could be warranted if smaller banks suffer deposit runs that pose the risk of contagion". Fed Chairman Jerome Powell assured the Nation that the banking system was "sound and resilient". Given the state of the teetering economy, such problems are unfortunate and must be managed closely if not aggressively as was done in these cases. Stay tuned.

Situational Awareness Nudges and Sludges - Part 1

Situational awareness was a lifesaving habit in our military career. Being aware of our surroundings and the potential threats helped us choose a course of action, often under stress, that led to mission success and protected our team.

Situational awareness is also a critical financial literacy skill. When faced with financial choices it is often difficult to know what is truly in our best interest. This is where the behavioral concept of "nudging" comes in. A nudge is a small change in the way information is presented to us that is intended to influence our behavior in a favorable way.

For example, a financial advisor might use a nudge to encourage us to save more money by offering an investment plan with automatic enrollment and a small initial contribution. This makes it easier for us to save money without requiring a lot of effort or decision-making.

Nudges can be a powerful tool for promoting positive behaviors, such as saving money or making healthier choices. However, they can also be used to manipulate behavior in a negative way, such as getting us to sign up for a financial product that do not meet our needs.

It is important to be aware of these tactics when evaluating financial products. Here are some tips for navigating nudges in financial products:

- **Research.** Understand the terms and potential risks. Seek unbiased sources of information, such as consumer protection websites.
- **Consider alternatives.** Don't assume the first option offered is the best. Compare features and fees to find the one that best meets our needs.
- Watch for hidden fees. Make sure we understand the total cost before signing up.
- Never unsubscribe if you didn't first subscribe. You're being tricked into letting them know you exist.
- Be alert for nudges. Know when we are being manipulated so we can know that the nudge is well intended and for our benefit.

Stay tuned for Part 2 of this article, where we will explore the more nefarious side of behavioral product and service design, known as "sludge."

POINTS TO PONDER

What is your comfort zone? And what might God want you to do about it?

In ancient Israel, General Joshua had a leadership challenge on his hands when seven of the twelve tribes were hanging out in their comfort zone. As a result, they were failing to go forth and fight for their portion of the land of Canaan.

"Then Joshua said to the children of Israel, 'How long will you neglect to go and possess the land which the Lord God of your fathers has given you?'" (Joshua 18:3)

The Israelite comfort zone was Shiloh, which had a lot to offer: The Tabernacle of worship; the manifest presence of God; access to the national leader team; a zone already cleared of Canaanites. In short, it was the known and familiar.

Today, Shiloh is at the heart of the most disputed territory on the planet: The so-called West Bank. It is actually biblical Samaria, and is where Abraham, Isaac and Jacob worked out God's covenant concerning this very land. This also is where Jesus met the woman at the well. But in between, Joshua needed the seven tribes to get out of their comfort zone. For it was God's intent to have His people possessing all of His land for His redemptive purpose for all of the earth.

With this in mind, ask yourself: What is my comfort zone? What is it to which I am over-attached? By remaining there, what other part of life and calling am I failing to possess? If I step out of my comfort zone, can I trust God to bring me into the new place and new relationships that He wants for me?

I try to remember that this is not all about me and my comfort, but about God and how He wants me to fulfill His purpose for being on the earth. So, step out of the comfort zone into the fullness!





SURVIVOR ASSISTANCE LESSONS LEARNED

October 2021 marked the 20th anniversary of TRICARE For Life (TFL). However, TFL has been under threat for years. Federal courts have held there is no legal basis for the claim to free health care for life for retirees and their dependents. However, an appellate court acknowledged the validity of retirees' claims and urged Congress to fulfill its moral to obligation to the retirees. After a long battle, TFL was established in the FY 2001 NDAA to provide wraparound coverage to pay unpaid Medicare costs. Recently there have been calls for a TFL enrollment fee and other beneficiary costs that increases the costs for Medicare-eligible retirees who currently rely on TFL.

According to the MOAA magazine, it was announced by Express Scripts in 2022 that nearly 15,000 pharmacies would be dropped from the TRICARE network because of contract renegotiating. These servicemembers, retirees, and families were being forced away from their neighborhood pharmacies. This "disproportionately impacts rural families, the elderly, those disabled, and those with chronic medical conditions".

A Surviving Spouse has enough challenges to face as things are, but having medical costs go up (for instance an expensive annual enrollment in TFL) and potentially having a hard time to find and access a trustworthy pharmacy does not help, especially if it's a long drive trying to care for someone with an acute illness.

Consider these things when you make your preparations for your family to face the inevitable!





"When Blue Star Turns to Gold Star"

In 1947 a Gold Star Lapel Pin was designed and created to represent a loved one who gave the ultimate sacrifice and was killed in combat. The pin shows a gold star on a field of purple surrounded by gold laurel leaves.

In 1973, a new pin was approved and called the Next of Kin Deceased Personnel Lapel Pin. This pin represents those armed service members to include Reserves and National Guard units in drill status, whose lives were lost while on active duty. The pin depicts a GOLD STAR on a gold background surrounded by four oak sprigs.

Both lapel pins have been authorized by an Act of Congress. The legal distinctions between the two pins are based on the place, time, and circumstances of the service person's death. Eligible family members include widow, widower, mother, father, stepparent, parent through adoption, foster parent in loco parentis, son, daughter, stepchild, child by adoption, brother sister, half-brother, half-sister. No other family members are legally eligible to receive the pin.

The title for this article is taken from a song which was released in 1918 during WWI. During times of war, family members would place BLUE STAR banners in their windows. The banners, originally made from silk, represented a loved one in service to our country at war. If that loved one was killed in service, the blue star was changed to gold. Each Star represents a family member actively serving Our Nation.

Lyrics to the Song:

When Blue Star Turns To Gold

When a blue service star turns to gold,

What a tale of affection is told!

Duty to country has cost one his all,

While others at home are bowed

down with the call

In their sorrow, the one's left behind,

Voice a pray'r that is e'er borne in mind

they must whisper "Good-bye"

The First Indochina War: 1953

French Forces sought an effective method to interdict Viet Minh supply lines in French Indochina. The "hedgehog" concept was developed. It called for French troops to establish fortified camps near Viet Minh supply routes.

French troops blocked Viet Minh's supplies, compelling them to fall back. This concept was based on the success at the Battle of Na San in late 1952. The French held the high ground around the Na San fortified camp which was supplied by air. They were able to repeatedly beat back assaults by General Vo Nguyen Giap's Viet Minh. troops.

The new French commander, General Henri Navarre, believed the approach used at Na San could be enlarged to force the Viet Minh to commit to a large, pitched battle where superior French firepower would destroy Giap's army.

Major General Rene Cogny first proposed the idea of creating a "mooring point" at Dien Bien Phu in northwest Vietnam in June 1953. Cogny envisioned a lightly defended airbase, but Navarre seized on the location for trying the hedgehog approach. Though his subordinates protested, pointing out that unlike Na San they would not hold the high ground around the camp, Navarre persisted, and planning moved forward.

Operation Castor commenced on November 20, 1953 when 9,000 French troops were dropped into the Dien Bien Phu area. With Colonel Christian de Castries in command, they quickly overcame local Viet Minh opposition and began building a series of eight fortified strong points transforming their anchoring point into a fortress by setting up seven satellite positions. Each was allegedly named after a former mistress of de Castries, although the allegation is unfounded. The eight names begin with letters from the first nine of the alphabet (all but F).

The fortified headquarters was centrally located, with positions "Huguette" (west) "Claudine" (south), "Dominique" (northeast), "Anne-Marie" (northwest), "Beatrice" (northeast), "Gabrielle" (north) and "Isabelle" (3.7 miles to the south), covering the reserve airstrip. Colonel de Castries' garrison increased to 10,800 men supported by artillery and ten M24 Chaffee light tanks.


Shuttlefest


